Correlates of self

A self-reported dental health index, comprising three questions asked of participants in the Rand Health Insurance Experiment, was examined. Index reliability was 0.69. One-way analysis of variance and Pearson's product-moment correlations were used to explore the bivariate associations between the index and sociodemographic variables, provider-assessed clinical indicators, and the respondent's report of a toothache.
